












# From the Principal's Desk

Eastwood Families,

I hope you will consider joining me at our *Coffee with the Principals* on October 21 at 9:30. During this meeting, I will share with you our current school performance successes and challenges. In addition please note that **students will not report to school on Tuesday, November 8th.** On this day, the MSDWT faculty will be participating in a Professional Development Day. Students will be required to participate in "At Home" learning activities. The "At Home" learning activities will take significantly less time for students to complete than the time they are in attendance on a regular school day. Therefore, the "At Home" learning requirement is not replacing a full instructional day.



This is not an "eLearning" day but will help test our capacity to deliver online instruction. Student participation in the "At Home" learning activities on November 8<sup>th</sup> is essential to grow our district's ability to provide online learning opportunities and extend classroom activities. If a student lacks the access to participate in the online portion of the activities, they will not be penalized. Students attending the AYS program will have computer access this day.



## Coming up:

Eighth grade students participated in two assessments through their Individuals and Societies classes: a Career Interest Inventory and a Skills Confidence Inventory. The career interest inventory measured which jobs matched up with their interests; the skills confidence measured which jobs matched with their skills. Students will use those results on their field trip on Friday, September 30.

Sixth graders will begin their career portfolios in October with their "Career Party" lessons in October through their Language and Literature classes. Seventh grade students will add to their portfolios in November by completing the Drive of Your Life with counselors in their Science classes. # 21st Century Scholars

It's Never too Early to start planning for college...
The Twenty-first Century Scholars Program can help!

The 21<sup>st</sup> Century Scholars program provides income-eligible students the opportunity to earn a scholarship that covers up to four years of tuition and regularly assessed fees (such as technology fees) at approved Indiana colleges. To see the list of colleges, please visit <a href="Scholars.IN.gov/eligiblecolleges">Scholars.IN.gov/eligiblecolleges</a>

21<sup>st</sup> Century Scholars also supports eligible students and parents with tools they need to prepare for college, graduate on time and start toward a successful career path. The scholarship is awarded on an annual basis. It does not cover the cost of books or room and board, and the funds are applied after any other student financial aid from the state is awarded.

Students that enroll in the program must meet the following requirements and take the Scholar Pledges in high school and college. Students must complete the Scholar Success Program which includes activities at each grade level in high school to help students plan, prepare and pay for college. Students must graduate from a state-accredited high school with a minimum of a Core 40 diploma and a GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. Students must also file for FAFSA in high school and not us illegal drugs, commit a crime or delinquent act, or consume alcohol before reaching the legal drinking age. 


