From the Principal's Desk

Hello Eastwood Middle School Families,

I hope each and every one of you had a pleasant Thanksgiving and that your children enjoyed the week long break. As we turn the corner to completion of this first semester, we have a number of tasks to complete including NWEA Winter Benchmark Assessments, summative assessments for content classes, and ensuring that students are mindful of completing quality work and submitting it on time.

This is also the time of year that we see an increase in illnesses due to flu and other viruses. Thanks to parents and guardians on working with our nurse to get 96% of our vaccination records in compliance with the state requirements, allowing students to attend classes after Thanksgiving break. Communication with all the various systems, requirements, and resulted in our non-compliance list going from an initial count of over 400 down to just 36. A big shout out to Mrs. Bonita Richardson, clinic nurse, for leading this effort!

Our goal is to ensure students stay healthy both physically and academically as well as socially and emotionally throughout this semester and holiday season. Please continue to have discussions with your child about his/her responsibility of contributing to the overall success of Eastwood Middle School by actively demonstrating the IB Learner Profile Traits.

Just a reminder that the final week before Winter Break is a four day week for students. That is, their final day of school is December 17th and teachers' final day for the semester is December 18th. School will resume on January 4th. As previously communicated, Mr. Tutin and Mrs. Mikus will assume the principal role in a co-interim capacity with the start of second semester and Mr. Hon, who retired as the EWMS AP/AD, is returning for second semester. As the transition moves forward, you can anticipate additional information.

Thank you to the parents and students who have provided their well wishes in my new endeavors. I will take many Eastwood memories with me and appreciate the opportunity I have been afforded here to work with your children, the staff, parents, and community.

COURSELOR'S CORRER

Bully Prevention: Sixth graders received a course in Bullysafe through their PE and Reading classes in November. Students were able express concerns to counselors and to teach each other how to respond to bullies, how to be helpful witnesses and bully prevention.

7th grade students received their bully prevention lesson through their math classes. Students discussed the importance of bystanders, how to inform adults and teachers and the difference between conflict and bullying. 8th graders had bully prevention lessons in their Science classes with Mrs. Mikus and Mr. Tutin. Students had the opportunity to learn from administrators and to voice their concerns.

Careers: 8th grade students completed two career assessments with Mrs. Hopkins and Mrs. Franklin in their Individuals and Societies classes. One assessment revealed a list of careers that matched their interests. The other assessment gave students a list of careers that matched their skills. 7th grade students will complete a career interest inventory the first week of December in their PE and Reading classes. This inventory is called "Drive of Your Life." Look for students to bring home a copy of their driver's license with possible careers!

6th grade students completed a learning styles interest inventory and a career party to explore possible careers. Students were able to talk about careers they have already considered and discover possibilities they had never heard of.

Community Service: There is so much going on at Eastwood Middle School!

- Electronic lunch benefitting Mozel Sanders Thanksgiving dinner. Students donate \$1 to use electronic devices during lunch. This event was sponsored by Eastwood's Young Professionals Development Group.
- Our annual canned food drive will be held from Monday, November 30 Friday, December 11. Students should bring in canned goods that will be donated to Second Presbyterian Church which houses a food pantry utilized by Washington Township families. We are looking for all types of non-perishable food items: baby food, canned milk, pasta, rice, soup, cereal, canned fruit, canned vegetables, etc. This event is sponsored by National Junior Honor Society
- Students will be able to donate \$1 to wear pajamas or hats on designated days to help to purchase toiletries and socks for homeless people in downtown Indianapolis. This is sponsored by National Junior Honor Society and Multicultural Scholars.

21st Century Scholars: 7th and 8th grade students are HIGHLY encouraged to register for 21st Century Scholars. This initiative is sponsored by the state of Indiana and guarantees financial help with college tuition. National Junior Honor Society: Congratulations to all 68 National Junior Honor Society members who were inducted after fall break. In our first meeting, students elected their peers to serve in leadership roles. Jaylen Wilkins was elected president, Mariah Hill was elected Vice President, Sean Oldham was elected Treasurer and Roy McDowell was elected Secretary. Each student is learning to serve in each role.

Mix It Up Day: Ms. Palmer, School Counseling intern, coordinated efforts to celebrate National Mix It Up day by having several lessons during Developmental Design about stereotyping and breaking down walls and barriers. The culminating event was that we "mixed it up" at lunch. Students were given numbers and had to sit at different tables with different people. During lunch, they had a bingo to complete which helped them to meet new friends and to learn new things about old ones.

College Go! Week: Ms. Wells, School Counseling intern, coordinated our College Go! Week. Each Developmental Design class picked a college, learned facts about that university and decorated the classroom door as a sign for that school. The winning classes were Ms. Sullivan in eighth grade, Mrs. Arnold in seventh grade and Mr. Vinton in sixth grade. Students were also encouraged to complete their 21st Century Scholars applications.

At our first quarter honors ceremony on October 27, we were honored to have former students and current high school seniors Shelise McElroy, Luke Haag and Jayna Ratcliff. Each of them shared about their amazing experiences at North Central and the wonderful opportunities that are ahead of them.

COURSELOR'S CORNER


8th graders went to the J. Everett Light Career Center on Tuesday, November 17. They had presentations on all of the programs of study offered there.

21st Century Scholars



It's Never too Early to start planning for college...
The Twenty-first Century Scholars Program can help!

The 21st Century Scholars program provides income-eligible students the opportunity to earn a scholarship that covers up to four years of tuition and regularly assessed fees (such as technology fees) at approved Indiana colleges. To see the list of colleges, please visit Scholars.IN.gov/eligiblecolleges

21st Century Scholars also supports eligible students and parents with tools they need to prepare for college, graduate on time and start toward a successful career path. The scholarship is awarded on an annual basis. It does not cover the cost of books or room and board, and the funds are applied after any other student financial aid from the state is awarded.

Students that enroll in the program must meet the following requirements and take the Scholar Pledges in high school and college. Students must complete the Scholar Success Program which includes activities at each grade level in high school to help students plan, prepare and pay for college. Students must graduate from a state-accredited high school with a minimum of a Core 40 diploma and a GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. Students must also file for FAFSA in high school and not us illegal drugs, commit a crime or delinquent act, or consume alcohol before reaching the legal drinking age. 

AVID UPDATE!

7th and 8th grade AVID classes have now begun tutorials! Mr. Ahlfeld's class gets to work with AVID tutors on Tuesdays and Miss Darling's class thinks critically about questions from homework, class notes, tests or quizzes with tutors and classmates on Thursdays. During these sessions, each AVID student presents his or her "Point of Confusion" to a small group of 6 to 8 students and a tutor. The student goes through vocabulary and prior knowledge about the topic and then is assisted in figuring out the problem by classmates with the tutor facilitating the questioning process. Group members take notes on each question so they too can gain more knowledge about the topic and help the presenter figure out the solution. Students then reflect on their learning and the tutorial process is complete. AVID students know that it's a lot of work, but it also is a great way to get a challenging question answered or to review a tricky concept from class!

On days that tutorials aren't going on, each AVID class works on WICOR strategies. W (writing), I (Inquiry), C (Collaboration), O (Organization) and R (Reading) each offer many opportunities to practice skills that will help students in their academic classes and in simply being a balanced learner and person. Mr. Ahlfeld's class has been working on Philosophical Chairs where students read an article about a topic and then are presented a statement related to the article. Students have to think about points from both sides and then they take part in a back and forth dialogue between the "agree" and "disagree" side. Listening, speaking and critical thinking are developed through this process. Ms. Darling's 7th Grade class has been working on Student Learning Logs. These writing and organization activities help student deeply reflect on the curriculum being taught in the content area classes. Students are also able to make important connections from what they are doing in their classrooms to their everyday lives!
