From the Principal's Desk

21st Century Scholars



It's Never too Early to start planning for college... The Twenty-first Century Scholars Program can help!

The 21st Century Scholars program provides income-eligible students the opportunity to earn a scholarship that covers up to four years of tuition and regularly assessed fees (such as technology fees) at approved Indiana colleges. To see the list of colleges, please visit Scholars.IN.gov/eligiblecolleges

21st Century Scholars also supports eligible students and parents with tools they need to prepare for college, graduate on time and start toward a successful career path. The scholarship is awarded on an annual basis. It does not cover the cost of books or room and board, and the funds are applied after any other student financial aid from the state is awarded.

Students that enroll in the program must meet the following requirements and take the Scholar Pledges in high school and college. Students must complete the Scholar Success Program which includes activities at each grade level in high school to help students plan, prepare and pay for college. Students must graduate from a state-accredited high school with a minimum of a Core 40 diploma and a GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. Students must also file for FAFSA in high school and not us illegal drugs, commit a crime or delinquent act, or consume alcohol before reaching the legal drinking age. STEP 1: Rental Sign Requests should be emailed/submitted to James Tutin - jtutin@msdwt.k12.in.us. Your email should include the following information:

- Planned method of payment (if check please include check #)

STEP 2: Payment of \$20 (cash or check) should be sent into school in an envelope marked ATHLETICS SIGN RENTAL. Please put your email address in the memo line.

STEP 3: Confirmation of your request will be sent via email and is based on the availability of the sign. Please note a 48 hour advance notice is required. Rental requests are filled on a first come/first serve basis. Reserve early to ensure that you are not disappointed.

EASTWOOD ATRICS



Dear Parents,

Daily exercise is a very important and getting your heart rate up is essential. Everyone should "PLAY 60", however, getting your heart rate up is only part of the equation. You need to know how hard to exercise. In all Physical Education classes, students are taught to figure out their THR (Target Heart Rate). When you figure out your THR then you will know how hard to exercise. You will want to exercise in THR zone. You can check this while exercising by taking your pulse. You can take your pulse for 6 seconds and add a zero. You can take your pulse either on the thumb side of the wrist or on the left side of your neck using your first two fingers.

You will need to figure out your RHR (Resting Heart Rate). You do this by taking your pulse for one minute on three consecutive mornings as soon as you wake up and taking the average of them. You will then need to figure out your MHR (Maximum Heart Rate) by using this formula:

the Box Tops for Education™ Coordinator for Eastwood.


Just a quick update on the progress of our Box Tops monthly drawings: to date,
