










COURTER CORRER

21st Century Scholars

It's Never too Early to start planning for college...
The Twenty-first Century Scholars Program can help!

The 21st Century Scholars program provides income-eligible students the opportunity to earn a scholarship that covers up to four years of tuition and regularly assessed fees (such as technology fees) at approved Indiana colleges. To see the list of colleges, please visit Scholars.IN.gov/eligiblecolleges

21st Century Scholars also supports eligible students and parents with tools they need to prepare for college, graduate on time and start toward a successful career path. The scholarship is awarded on an annual basis. It does not cover the cost of books or room and board, and the funds are applied after any other student financial aid from the state is awarded.

Students that enroll in the program must meet the following requirements and take the Scholar Pledges in high school and college. Students must complete the Scholar Success Program which includes activities at each grade level in high school to help students plan, prepare and pay for college. Students must graduate from a state-accredited high school with a minimum of a Core 40 diploma and a GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. Students must also file for FAFSA in high school and not us illegal drugs, commit a crime or delinquent act, or consume alcohol before reaching the legal drinking age. SCHOOL HOURS REMINDER!

Parents, please note that Eastwood's doors are open to students between the hours of <u>9:10am - 4:20pm</u>. Any time before or after these times, your child will need to be under adult supervision at all times.

We ask that students are picked up in a timely manner at the completion of school and/or evening activities.

EWMS is not able to provide supervision prior to 9:10AM due to other morning obligations. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to use the bus system when at all possible. When dropping off your child, please do so as close to 9:00am as possible to reduce the number of unaccompanied minors outside the school.

Eastwood Front Desk Tips – Did you know???

If you need to pick up a student early from school due to an appointment...

You can send a note in with your student! Have them take the note to the front desk, and the front desk volunteer will write your student a pass that will excuse them from class at the appropriate time. They will be waiting for you in the student center when you arrive to pick them up.

For appointments scheduled same day, you can call the front desk at least two hours before you plan to pick them up (preferably before lunchtime) and we will write your student a pass and have it delivered to them.

We cannot call students down until you arrive, so please send in a note or give us at least two hours to get a pass to them if you want them to be waiting for you.

We check IDs of everyone entering the building, and especially for anyone signing a student out of the building.

No exceptions! Please make sure to bring your photo ID with when visiting our building—we will ask you to retrieve it if you don't.

Any person you want to be able to pick up your child MUST be listed either as a guardian or under the Emergency Contacts section of your enrollment form.

In those cases when you need to authorize someone other than those primary contacts, you must either call ahead to Ms. Bradley or send in a note to the front desk with specific name and relationship information. As always, we will require that person to show photo ID.

Please be aware...

Depending on time of day and building conditions, we may ask you the reason for your visit to our school before buzzing you into the building. Please do not take offense; everything we do is for the safety and security of our students and staff.

Did you know???

The people sitting behind the front desk are parent volunteers! We are happy to help you in any way we can, and if we can't help you we know who can. Thanks for your support and welcome to Eastwood Middle School!



EW PHYSICAL EDUCATION





Dear Parents:

Did you know that Indiana has moved from fifteenth to seventh place on the list of states having the most people who are obese? Child-hood obesity has become an overwhelming problem, and if it is not addressed, these children will become obese adults. Now is the time for our children to learn fitness habits that they can continue to follow throughout their lives. Childhood obesity not only affects a student's self-esteem, it can also lead to heart disease, diabetes, high blood pressure, and joint problems. The Physical Education Department is committed to providing programs in the five areas of fitness that will help children develop good habits. Those areas of emphasis are:

- ⇒ Cardiovascular Endurance
- ⇒ Muscular Endurance
- ⇒ Muscular Strength
- ⇒ Flexibility
- ⇒ Body Composition

The staff of the Physical Education and Health Department have many areas of expertise. We have certified instructors in Exercise Physiology, Health, Kinesiology, and Physical Education. All students must take one semester of Physical Education each year of their middle school years. Students may also choose from a large selection of after school programs in athletics and intramurals.

Each year Physical Education teachers work to improve the curriculum through brainstorming, research, professional development opportunities, and discussion with other professionals. Our goal is to help all students understand the importance, as well as the pleasure of, being physically fit

The health and fitness levels of your children are very important to us. That is why we try to make certain that all students are getting the physical fitness opportunities that meet their needs. We cannot, however, do this without your help. Participating in fitness activities with your children, talking about the importance of physical activity, and encouraging them to participate in extra-curricular fitness-based programs will ensure that they grow up to be healthy, active adults.








OFFICER'S BULLETIN

Well hello Parents, Students and Staff. In this month's article I would like to take a little time out and not speak on topics of safety but to speak on a phrase I tell students quite often. "You are what you respond to".



You know, I can remember growing up as a middle school young man and being called names that many called disrespectful and just plain out mean. Especially being from a bi-racial family the names really came hard and affected me in many ways. But one thing I can remember my mother telling me over and over again was "Son you have the best of BOTH worlds". I still carry that with me till this day and think of it often when I hear students in a similar predicament, and I pass on what was told to me.

Now, I don't know if the words students say now can be compared to the words back when, but it seems they are harsher. Students now are using more racial, profane, explicit and just down right MEAN words. And to make matters worse, there are so many more platforms for students to

express this such as social media, friends, haters and just anybody who wants to see drama.

I have students in my office on a daily basis telling me about the latest person who has called them names, "called them out of their name" or being disrespectful. I also have students in my office who are defending themselves about calling someone names. Either way, I choose to tell them "You are what you respond to".

In my years working with middle school students I have found this works well and it's very beneficial. Now, I will be honest it's only effective once the student has come down off their very charged emotional high. Once a student is in my office, I let them vent. There are parameters in this venting process such as keeping your hands to yourself, language and voice to a respectful level. But once they have completed this process we simply speak on their actions and response to the name calling or disrespect. I stress to them you're going to be called many names if you live long enough. So many that soon you will be able to say "oops, heard that one before". But moreover I express to them "you are what you respond to". Why give someone the satisfaction to call you a name, whatever it may be and you respond to them negatively letting them win the battle. If you respond to them by the name you have been called if it's not your birth given name then again they have won you over. My name is Officer Edwards or my birth name of Freddie Edwards. If you call me Johnny or a mean, disrespectful name why respond. "YOU ARE WHAT YOU RESPOND TO"

PARENTS: I also encourage you to be active and involved in your child. I know society has created many barriers for us balancing work; school, friends, and many other events but stay active with your child. Question them. Challenge them. Be nosey. Be loving. Set standards.


